

- •Largest steel producer on the African continent with capacity of 8.0 mt of liquid steel per annum of which 65% is flat and 35% is long
- •Modern, highly competitive supplier of steel products with turnover of R26bn
- •Global standing underpinned by being part of the world's largest steel producer ArcelorMittal
- •Relationship with ArcelorMittal facilitates worldclass R & D, best practice processes, aggressive procurement contracts, and international market leverage
- ArcelorMittal South Africa is amongst the world's lowest cash cost producers





A Committed South African Citizen



- ArcelorMittal South Africa's long standing commitment to South Africa will continue
 - Approximately ZAR15bn invested since 2001/2 including the payment of R2,8 billion for the undivided share
 of the mining right over Sishen and R8bn in capex over last five years
- Major employer committed to sustainable job creation
 - 9,145 employees in South Africa, with an additional 2,500 on contract
 - Despite market meltdown and ArcelorMittal South Africa reporting losses in 2009, no job losses in workforce
- ArcelorMittal South Africa remains fully committed to complying with all BEE legislation
 - An equity transaction has been announced in August 2010 (see separate slides)
- ArcelorMittal South Africa has an outstanding social development programme
 - Contributes in the form of bursaries to engineering students, specifically at math & science facilities
 - Development programme for black engineering firms successfully launched
 - Building of schools across the country
- World class safety initiatives underway at all South African operations
- Local industry being comprehensively supported in supplying the requirements of the public sector infrastructure development programme
- The Department of Labour has recognized ArcelorMittals's position of pre-eminence in the technical skills development arena








Vanderbijlpark Works Process Configuration






Domestic Sales: Prime Volume 2010






Domestic sales: Prime Volume per segment 2010






Export Sales: Prime Volume per Segment 2010






Export: Volumes per Region 2010
